Before Heading Out or to Bed

Blow out lit candles when you leave the room or go to bed. Turn off all light strings and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.

FACTS

- More than one-third of home decoration fires are started by candles.
- More than two of every five decoration fires happen because decorations are placed too close to a heat source.



Trim the Tree with Fire Safety

- When choosing a real tree, pick one that has been freshly cut; Needles should not fall off when touched
- Make a fresh cut five centimetres (two inches) off the base of the trunk before placing the tree in the stand
- Add water to the tree stand every day
- Make sure the tree is at least one metre (three feet) away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights
- Never place lit candles on the tree
- Discard the tree when it dries out and large amounts of needles begin to fall off



Becoming a firefighter:

What you need to know

- No previous experience is necessary to become a volunteer firefighter and volunteers train to professional standards.
- Volunteer firefighters are all ages, male and female, and come from many diverse backgrounds.
- Volunteers are paid on-call for their response, training and practices.
- All required personal protective equipment and training are provided — there are no out-of-pocket costs.
- Your local volunteer fire department constantly needs to recruit volunteers to replace members who retire or move away.
- Volunteer firefighters commit to two hours a week of training at their local fire hall.
- The federal government provides tax credits to volunteer firefighters who serve at least 200 hours per year. Visit the municipal website to download an application
